- Increased our focus on Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion initiatives

- Collaborated with Western University and Schulich School of Medicine and Dentistry to conduct research on Examining Individualized Participatory Approaches to Care for Individuals with Intellectual and Developmental Disabilities

### Strategy & Policy Committee

The Strategy and Policy Committee's mandate is to ensure that the Board has the capacity, policies, and processes in place to effectively govern PHSS as a not-for-profit corporation in the province of Ontario. The Committee aids the Board in addressing matters not covered by another Board Committee.

Over the past year, the Committee met ten times and was active in supporting the Board and the CEO in the following areas:

- Implementing a new Board Committee structure that resulted in the formation of the new Communications & Marketing Committee, enhancing the mandates of the Finance and Quality & People Supported Committees, and replacing the previous Policy & Oversight Committee with the Strategy & Policy Committee. This aligns the Board Committees broadly with PHSS' evolving strategic direction as PHSS focuses governance on moving forward from the last three years of living with COVID-19.
- Enhancing the Board's focus on Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion including overseeing PHSS' associated developments.
- Revising PHSS' bylaw and the new corporate name of PHSS Support Services.



- Monitoring of directions received from Provincial Ministries and agencies that have oversight of PHSS and oversight of non-financial aspects of PHSS' service agreements, and enterprise risk assessment.
- Advising and supporting the CEO in representing PHSS with various external developments and responding to the directions and priorities of the Ministry of Children, Community and Social Services, the Ministry of Health, and Home and Community Care Services, including provincial initiatives associated with Ontario Health Teams and Long-Term Ventilation Program.
- Overseeing the CEO's performance as well as significant developments and events that occur during the year.

The Committee membership includes Brian Orr (Chair), Catherine Sexton (Vice Chair), Margaret Szilassy (Vice Chair), Maureen Reid (Secretary), and Linda Coffin (Treasurer). Brian Dunne serves as an ex officio member.

# Quality and People Supported Committee

We are a committee of the PHSS Board of Directors. Our membership includes board members, families, community members, a supported individual, as well as leadership staff.

The Committee's mandate is to ensure PHSS is fulfilling its promise and obligations to individuals receiving support and to oversee the quality of support and care provided across the full range of PHSS services. This is done in the following ways:

### Monthly Interveiws

- Complete 10 interviews a year
- New: 6-month follow-ups being completed
- New: Developed new interview questions for the different services PHSS provides (You at Home, day and overnight respite, residential supports)



#### Participatory Action Research (PAR)

PAR involves voluntary interviews with supported individuals, their families, and feedback from staff and are done to understand more about the life of people supported by PHSS and their extended community.



#### **Cross Functional Team**

Our Committee utilizes the engagement survey results to assist in directing the actions of this team to enhance the staff experience at PHSS.

# The 50-30 Challenge

#### The 50 – 30 Challenge is an initiative between the Government of Canada, Canadian businesses and diversity organizations.

The goal of the program is to challenge Canadian organizations to increase the representation and inclusion of diverse groups within their workplaces, while highlighting the benefits of giving all Canadians a seat at the table. The PHSS Board will achieve this goal by:

- 1.Sustaining gender parity with the number of directors being at least (50% women and/or non-binary people); and
- 2.Pursue increasing representation of its directors, to at least 30% over time, of members of other equity-deserving groups, including those who identify as Racialized, Black, and/or people of colour ("Visible Minorities"), people with disabilities (including invisible and episodic disabilities), 2SLGBTQ+ and/or gender and sexually diverse individuals, and Aboriginal and/or Indigenous Peoples. The program and participants recognize Indigenous Peoples, including First Nations, Métis, and Inuit, as founding peoples of Canada.

We are thrilled to begin this transformative journey as we embrace Canada's 50-30 challenge! Our DEI Committee stands by the belief that diversity fuels innovation and inclusion creates excellence.

Together, we strive to build a more vibrant, equitable, and united community where every individual thrives and their unique talents shine.

### **Financials**

The Treasurer's Report provides a complete narrative of PHSS for the 2022/23 fiscal year.

I am honoured to provide the report on the financial position of PHSS for the fiscal year ending March 31, 2023. As chair of the Finance



Committee, our work includes providing oversight of financial practices and systems necessary for the Board to fulfill its financial governance obligations and we do this through meetings, review of financial reports, and other activities.

The financial statements were audited by Graham Scott Enns LLP Chartered Professional Accountants. The auditors provide an independent opinion on the fair presentation of the financial position of PHSS.

#### For PHSS 2022/23 continued to be a year of growth with the following highlights:



The operating revenue and expenditures increased by more than 10% allowing PHSS to serve five more people with continued growth in the Ottawa community.



Since 2017, the Clarke Road location has fulfilled the PHSS vision of an intentional community and continues to be a success with full occupancy and an operating surplus.



The multi-year project called 'Digital by Design' envisions to modernize our technology and business processes. Digital by Design will support our provincial growth and achieve efficiencies for staff and the people we support.




